Librarian Report Quarter 3 FY18 Submitted by: Librarian, Andrea Corvin

Every April, during National Volunteer Appreciation Week, we like to honor the library volunteers and the significant role they play in everyday library operations, ultimately, creating a substantial, positive impact on our community. Did you know that since June 2009 up until this past March 2018, library volunteers have logged **2,2573 hours total** or about **213 hours a month** in support of the library?! If you multiply that with Santa Fe County minimum wage (\$10.91) they've contributed about **\$246,271** worth of work to the Town! Thank you, library volunteers, for your continued care and



unwavering dedication to Edgewood; we couldn't do it without you! Please make sure to drop by the library April 16 – April 21 to show some appreciation with a kind word to a library volunteer!



The library hosted four special events this quarter beginning with a Valentine's themed Paint Party. Participants were provided with colorful acrylics, brushes, canvas boards and a little inspiration; the results were fantastic! The next event, DIY Day, featured a do-it-yourself project where participants mixed together newspaper pulp, cement, and perlite to form papercrete gardening planters. Everyone LOVED this working with this messy yet unique medium and some even made more than one! The Library partnered with the experts at Liberty Tax to offer two, free educational workshops for the community on taxes after retirement and the new tax laws. 

The library is getting closer to achieving its collection development goals for the fiscal year. Two large book orders were placed containing over four-hundred titles. Most have already arrived and have been cataloged Assistant Librarian, Barbara, and several volunteers are continuing to re-classify and re-label the Young Adult and Juvenile sections under a single Youth category to make the collections more easily discoverable for library patrons.

In other news, the Librarian represented NM public libraries, receiving an introduction on the Senate floor, during this past legislative session on Library Legislative Day, January 26. The librarian made good use of the trip by making visits to legislators' offices with literature (see attached) on how State Grants in Aid and GO Bond funds have benefitted the Edgewood Community Library over the years. The biggest library legislative item this session had to do with broadband proliferation in NM via public libraries' participation in federal E-Rate funding. Many libraries have been reluctant to apply for this funding because the process is quite complex and burdensome and have asked for support. Legislators and the Governor have answered our plea by establishing the Library Broadband and Infrastructure Fund! Although no funds were allocated


Summer Reading Program Calendar of Events


